Story, Story

Draw and Label

Draw and label your spelling words. You MUST colour your drawings and labels.

Don't forget to add a lot of great detail! Do your very best work!

Squiggly Spelling Words

You are going to write your spelling words two times. First write in regular letters. Then write the words again in squiggly letters!

Blue Vowels!

Write each of your spelling words.

You will need a blue coloured pencil.

Trace over the vowels in each word with your blue coloured pencil.

Vowels = a e i o u

Bubble Letters

Write your spelling words in bubble letters. After you write your words in bubble letters, colour your words with a crayon or colored pencil.

Bubble Letters Rock!

Three Times!

Write each spelling word three times.

First, write each word in pencil.

Second write each word in crayon.

Third, write each word in marker.

You MUST write neatly!

Acrostic Poem

Choose one of your spelling words. Write an acrostic poem for that word.

You must also ILLUSTRATE your poem.

*<u>Example</u>: Fun in the sky.

fly Laps around clouds.

Yes! I'm free!

Adding My Words

Each letter has a value.

*Consonants are worth 10.

*Vowels are worth 5.

Write your spelling words. Then add up the value of each spelling word.

Example-

said- 10 + 5 + 5 + 10 = 30

Dr Who Letter

Your job is to write a creative letter to Dr Who (or another super hero).

In your letter, you must use each of your spelling words. Be sure to underline your words as you use them.

Spelling Shapes

Count your spelling words. Draw one shape for each word. Then write your spelling words inside each of the shapes.

Examples:

babies

cried

Spelling Poem

Write a poem using several of your spelling words. <u>Underline</u> the words that you use. Illustrate your poem.

You can write any type of poem that you like. Enjoy!

scrambled Words

Fold a piece of paper three times lengthwise (making three long rectangular columns).

Write your words in the first column.

Then write them again with the letters all mixed up (scrambled) in the second column.

Put your words aside. Come back later to unscramble your words. Write the unscrambled words in the third column.

Consonant Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the consonants in your words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Vowel Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the vowels in your spelling words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Buzzing Bees

Draw and colour an outdoor picture.

Count your spelling words. Draw a
bee for each of your spelling words.

Then write the words inside each of
the "spelling" bees. Write neatly!

Crazy Spelling Story

Write a crazy spelling story using each of your spelling words.

Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them.

Illustrate and color your story!

Clap it Out

Clap out your spelling words syllable by syllable e.g

a- no-ther

Sat-ur-day

Now try and write them down.

Connect the Dots

Write ten of your spelling words in dots.

Then connect the dots by tracing over them with a coloured pencil.

30 Second Words

Write a TV commercial using all of your spelling words.

Read it to a parent or sibling!

Spelling Tennis

Work in threes. One person is the 'reader' and 'checker'. The other two spell the word by saying letters until the whole word is spelt. If a mistake is made, the checker stops the game and shows them the correct spelling. The word is then spelt again and then put to the bottom of the pile. Correct words are discarded. Take turns to be the checker.

Dictionary Race

Work in threes using a dictionary each. Take turns to call out one of the spelling words then hide it.

Can you be the first to find the word in the dictionary?

Code Words

Come up with a code for each letter of the alphabet. Write down your code.

*<u>Example</u>: a=



p=



Then write your spelling words in code.

You must write the actual spelling word

next to the "code word."

Fancy Letters

Write each of your spelling words using fancy letters.

Your letters can have curly-q's or dots, for example. Have fun!

sign Your Words

Use sign language finger spelling to sign the spelling of your words.

to see animated hands making the letters so you can practice!

UPPER and Lower

Write your spelling words two times each.

First, write each word in UPPERCASE letters. Second, write each word in lowercase letters.

*Example- SLIDE slide

Colourful Words

Write each of your spelling words. Write each letter using a different colored pencil!

*Example- colourful

Across and Down

Write each of your spelling words across and then down (starting with the first letter).

Use Play-Doh or clay to sculpt your spelling words.



Write your spelling words in the air using your finger. Have a partner read your words as you write them

OR have a partner air write and your job is to read the words.

secret Agent Words

Number the alphabet from 1-26. Example: a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, etc. Then convert your words to a number code.

You must write the actual spelling word next I to the "code word."

Back Writing

Use your finger to spell out each of your spelling words, one letter at a time, on your mom or dad's back.

Then it's YOUR turn to try to FEEL and spell!

Spell-er-size!

Pretend you are a cheerleader and call out the letters of your words!

Cheer up high for letters that touch the top handwriting line (ex. t and l), hands on hips for middle letters (ex. a and e), and cheer down low for low letters (Ex. y and j).

Choo-Choo Words


Write the entire list end-to-end as one long word (like a train). Use a different colored crayon for each word.

Make a square which has three dots in each row. If the word is spelled correctly, you can connect three dots. When a square is formed, you can write your initials in the box.



Disappearing Words

Play in a group of 4, 5 or 6. Have your words written on cards and laid out on the table. Study the words. Choose someone to take a card while the rest hide their eyes. Turn back and look at the cards left. You have 2 minutes to write the missing word on a whiteboard, hide your guess then do ,2,1, Show Me! You win a point only if it is spelt correctly!

Walk About

The whole class walks about with their 'Words of the Week' books. When the teacher says 'Swap!' swap books with the person nearest you, they should ask you 3 of your words. If you both get them right, you can move on, if anyone doesn't you can look at them and try again!

Noughts and Crosses

2 players put their spelling words in front of them. The first person takes a card and reads it out. Their partner has to spell it on their whiteboard. If they spell it correctly, they can put a 0 or a X on the board.

Three in a row wins the game!

Nopscotch Words

Make a hopscotch board on your sidewalk or driveway with chalk.

Write letters instead of numbers and HOP your words!

Letter Writing

Write a friendly letter to a friend or family member using each of your words.
Underline the spelling words that you use in your letter.

After your homework is checked, you can MAIL your letter!!

Magazine Words

Use an old magazine and find your words (or the letters that make up your word).

Cut them out and glue on your paper.

Match-Up

Write each of your words on two different index cards. Turn all the cards face down and mix them up. Lay out your cards in rows (like Concentration) and flip over two cards at a time. Read each card aloud to see it they match. Keep them if they match or flip over and try again!

sentence, Please

Write sentences using each of your spelling words. You may use more than one word in a sentence, but you must write at least 10 sentences.

Underline your spelling words.

Spelling Flowers

Draw a picture of a great big flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the flower petals or on a leaf. Draw extra flowers if you run out of room.

Surround Words

Write your words on graph paper. Write "middle" letters, one letter in each box.

Use two boxes for "tall" letters like t and I and "low" letters like j and g. Then outline the words using different colors.

Telephone Words

First write your words in a list.
Then look at your telephone keypad.
Translate each letter into the numbers on the keypad. Now write your spelling words using this code!

Joss a Word

Toss (or roll) a ball back and forth with a partner.

You say the 1st letter, and then toss and your partner says 2nd letter, and in so forth.

Type Em

Type your spelling words on the computer. Make each word have a different font. You can even email your words to me.

Word Search

Make a word search puzzle using your spelling words.

Then find your words!

Trace Around

Write each of your spelling words using a pencil. Then trace around each word with a crayon, colored pencil, or a marker.

Nords Within Word

Write each spelling word and then write at least two words made from the same letters that is hidden inside the word.

Example: slide side lie lid led etc.

Newsy Words

Use old magazines, catalogs, or newspapers to cut out letters.

Glue the letters down on a piece of paper to spell your words.

Other Handed

First write your spelling words the way you usually do it.

Then, try writing the list with your other hand!

Pasta Words

Arrange alphabet pasta or Alphabits cereal to form your spelling words. Glue onto a piece of paper.

gractice Tesx

Take a practice test. Have your Mum or Dad ask you to spell your spelling words. Write them on a list. Check your practice test and correct any missed words. This would be an especially good activity to complete on Thursday night.

Sound Words

Use a phone or mp3 player to record your spelling words and their spelling. Then listen to it, checking to see that you spelled all the words correctly.

Spelling Baseball

Draw four bases on a piece of paper or lay out four pillows to be the bases. The pitcher selects a word. If the batter can spell the word correctly, he moves forward one base.

A point is earned every time you pass home plate.

Words Without Consonants

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the consonants with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing consonants.

spelling Bee

Practice your spelling words in Spelling Bee style.

Spell your words out loud to a parent or sibling.

Words without Vowels

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the vowels with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing vowels.

Spelling Flashcards

Make a set of flashcards to practice your spelling words. When you look at your flashcard, read the word and then spell it out loud.

*Example- there t-h-e-r-e.

Make Some Music!

Write a song or rap that includes your words!

Share with a friend or family member.

Morse Code

Use Morse Code to spell your words.

It is a series of dots (1 count) and dashes (3 counts). Check out this site,

http://www.morsecode.dutch.nl/alphabet.html

to see the international (NATO) Morse Code so you can practice!

scrabble

Use Scrabble tiles to spell out your spelling words.

For a little extra math practice, figure out the point value of each of your words!

spell, Spell, Swap

Take one of your spelling words, when the teacher says 'go!', walk about until you meet another member of their group. Then ask each other to spell their word. If they get it wrong, show them the word and then try again. Once both of you have spelled the word, **SWap** and go off to meet another person from your group.

Delicious Words

Spray a small amount of whipped cream (or anything else you can eat) on a plate and spread it out.
